- 3. **Three letters** of recommendation; one letter from a community leader, one from a school counselor or advisor, and one letter from a teacher or instructor. Please do not use family members as a reference.
- 4. An essay: Describe a problem you've solved or a problem you'd like to solve in your American Indian community. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution (One page only; Responses must be typed)
- 6. If you choose to do so, write a brief statement of any financial **hardships** you may have.
- 7. Copy of letter of admission/acceptance from a college or university. If a letter is not available, please make a notation and send it as soon as possible. No student will be awarded a scholarship until United Tribes has received "proof of enrollment" from your college.
